Annual Report Fiscal Year 2004

Executive Summary

Ohio Community Correction Act (CCA) programs are non-residential sanctions that allow local courts to sanction certain offenders in the community saving scarce prison and jail beds for violent offenders. This program is a partnership between the State of Ohio and Local Corrections Planning Boards. Each Planning Board is comprised of local officials representing specific areas of the criminal justice system within the county. During Fiscal Year 2004, the CCA subsidy programs received a funding appropriation of \$ 22,388,966 to support jail and prison diversion programs in 78 counties throughout Ohio.

CCA Prison Diversion Programs

In Fiscal Year 2004, Prison Diversion Programs received \$14,446,755 to support programs in 45 counties throughout Ohio.

- ◆ 9,442 offenders participated in CCA prison diversion programs:
 - ◆ \$1,530 annual average cost per offender
 - ◆ 14.% convicted of 3rd degree felony
 - ◆ 28% convicted of 4th degree felony
 - ◆ 51% convicted of 5th degree felony
 - ◆ 79% Male
 - ◆ 52% White
 - ◆ 45% African American
 - ◆ Average age at admission 32 years old
 - ◆ 48% successful termination
 - ◆ Average length of stay 288 days

CCA Jail Diversion Programs

In Fiscal Year 2004, Jail Diversion Programs received \$7,942,211 to support programs in 76 counties throughout Ohio.


- ◆ 20,022 offenders participated in CCA jail diversion programs:
 - ◆ \$397 annual average cost per offender
 - ◆ 4% convicted of 4th degree felony
 - ◆ 13% convicted of 5th degree felony
 - ◆ 78% convicted of misdemeanor crimes
 - ◆ 77% Male
 - ◆ 71% White
 - ◆ 26% African American
 - ◆ Average age at admission 32 years old
 - ◆ 76% successful termination
 - ◆ Average length of stay 150 days

Year End Highlights:


- ◆ Tuscarawas County Intensive Supervision Prison Diversion Program received the Clifford Skeen Award.
- ◆ Paulding Co. Standard Probation Jail Diversion Program received the Clifford Skeen Award .
- ◆ Sheila Taylor, Program Director for Canton Municipal Court, received the Community Correction Act Professional Achievement Award.
- ◆ Jail and Prison Diversion Offenders performed over 355,822 hours of community service work within their respective communities.
- ◆ Offenders earned \$76,112,544; paid \$1,923,463 in restitution; \$4,226,537 in court costs; and \$1,411,221 in child support.
- ◆ Over 17,786 offenders received drug and alcohol abuse counseling.


PRISON DIVERSION PROGRAMS




JAIL DIVERSION PROGRAMS
