AVAILABLE PROGRAMMING

Reentry and rehabilitation begins as soon as you enter the reception facility. The following is just some of programming that is available at the Lorain Correctional Institution; the majority of these programs are run by offenders.

- Alcoholics and Narcotics Anonymous
- Cage your rage
- Thinking for a Change
- The Ridge Project-TYRO Dads
- Gambling and Smoking Cessation Programs
- Bad Dads
- Music Appreciation
- Thinking Matters
- Anger, Power, Violence

The vision of ODRC is to reduce crime in Ohio.

The mission of ODRC is to reduce recidivism among those we touch.

To aid in achieving our vision and mission the below hierarchy for system reform was created in order to assist in Rehabilitation and successful reentry of the offenders we supervise.



HOUSE BILL 86

House Bill 86 provides language on sentencing reform.

- Earned Credit is increased from 1 to 5 days for certain offenders;
- 80% Release allows for the Director of ODRC to recommend to the sentencing court to consider judicial release for an offender who has served 80% of his or her sentence;
- Certificate of Achievement and Employability gives an offender who has participated in designated programming and community service a certificate that can aid in overcoming employment barriers that may exist in a potential job or career for which the inmate trained in during incarceration;
- Judicial Release may be granted by your sentencing Judge after you have served a portion of your sentence and if you meet certain qualifications, your Judge may also request a summary of your discipline and programming activity to aid in making this decision.

APPROVED FUNDS

Only approved (or tentatively approved) visitors may send funds to an inmate in the ODRC. This applies to all methods of depositing money to include money orders by mail to Jpay, Internet (offenderconnect.com) telephone and kiosks. Approved (or tentatively approved) visitors must comply with security verification procedures to ensure that they are on the visiting list.

TELEPHONE DEPOSITS

Approved visitors may deposit funds by calling toll-free 1-888-265-1238, reference Site ID 86 when prompted by the automated attendant. Deposits can be made through the toll-free number using credit or debit cards. There is a transaction fee for using this service.

Funds from an unapproved source, as defined by Administrative Rule 5120-5-02, will not be accepted

Intake Schedule

Day of Arrival:

All offenders will be processed in Receiving and Discharge
During the process the following will occur:

- Inmate number and ID given;
- Property is inventoried;
- Hair cut;
- Initial medical screening; and
- Clothing, shoes, bedding and towel is issued.

Once you arrive in the intake unit, the following activities will be completed:

- Orientation;
- Complete the Orientation Checklist;
- Visiting list entered;
- Suicide Prevention Video shown; and
- PREA video played in the intake housing units M-F

Day 2:

- Lab work administered;
- PREA video shown to all inmates;
- Orientation from unit staff, classification, and recovery services presented.

Day 3:

- Required education testing administered;
- The facilitator will explain the programs offered in our education department;
- Inmates complete an academic test (CASAS); and
- All inmates under the age of 22 are interviewed at this time to determine if there is any history of special educational services.

Day 4 & 5:

- Inmates escorted to Medical for physicals and Mental Health screenings;
- Inmate Orientation Aide will conduct/facilitate orientation Power Point covering service areas, mail, visiting, inmate funds, early release, sanitation, and transfers/classification;
- If phone pins are available you will program your phone; and
- An assessment of programming needs is completed.

After 10 Days

- Inmates are moved from the intake units to the reception units to await classification

Day 90

- Average transfer date to parent institution.

VISITING SCHEDULES

Inmates are allowed four (4) visits a month, two (2) from each person listed on the approved visiting list. The first visit will be allowed after the inmate has been at the reception center for eight (8) days. Visitors must purchase a vending card in the entry building to make food purchases during the visit.

There is no reception visitation on holiday's or the day after Christmas.

The reception visiting schedule is as follows:

Tuesday through Friday from 8-11am and 12-3pm according to the last digit of your inmate number. Odd numbers visit on odd days of the month and even numbers visit on even days of the month. Visiting is limited to a maximum of 4 visitors per inmate at one time, unless special arrangements have been made in advance. Reservations are not required.

DRC 3- TIER PRISON SYSTEM

DRC prisons operate under a 3-Tier System of Management. Each level of the 3 -Tier System is designed to match the behavior of the individual inmate. The 3- Tier System is designed to allow offenders who take personal responsibility for their own growth, the ability to move through each stage, and have the opportunity to witness how pro-social behavior is rewarded.

- **Tier 1, Reintegration Prison (Level 1)** - The ability to skill build, connect with the community, and to assist with the transition into the community.
- **Tier 2 General Population Prison (Levels 2 & 3)**
The ability to skill build through programs. The goal is to prepare inmates to enter Reintegration Prisons.
- **Tier 3 Control Prison (Level 4 & 5)** Inability to adjust at a Tier 2. Provide programs in a restricted setting and assist with the gradual transition back to general population.

The goal is to create a positive outcome with your life and less of a chance to return to prison after release
