

Intensive Prison Program (IPP) Screening Process

- Upon arriving at reception (LORCI/CRC/ORW), the offender's case is screened to determine if he/she meets the basic criteria regarding sentence, previous criminal history, etc., for the IPP.
- If the offender meets the basic criteria, he/she will be invited to attend an orientation program regarding the IPP.
- If the offender decides that he would like to be considered for the IPP, the offender will be given the opportunity to read and sign the IPP Application Form.
- If the offender is deemed appropriate for placement by the DRC, notification will be sent to the offender's sentencing judge via certified mail. At that time, the judge can disapprove the offender's participation in the IPP. If the judge remains silent, the offender will be placed in the IPP.
- If the offender changes his mind prior to being placed in the IPP, he/she does have the right to revoke his application. However, once admitted to the IPP, an inmate is not permitted to voluntarily withdraw from the IPP within twenty-one days of admittance.

If the sentencing judge does not want to consider Transitional Control or IPP, it can be documented in the Journal Entry at the time of sentencing. This may reduce some unnecessary paperwork that the DRC sends to the sentencing courts.
