Dear Director Mike McGrath:

In accordance with Section 5120.10 of the Ohio Revised Code and Executive Order 92-03 of the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, the Cleveland House of Corrections, a full service jail, was inspected on 12/14/2016. The inspection was restricted to assessing compliance with a group of standards, selected from the Standards for Jails in Ohio promulgated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. The group of standards being inspected focused on Reception & Release, Classification, Security, Housing, Sanitation and Environmental Conditions, Communication, Visitation, Medical and Mental Health Services, Food Service, Recreation and Programming, Inmate Discipline, Administrative Segregation, Grievance, Staffing, and Staff Training. The inspection consisted of this Inspector receiving and/or reviewing requested documentation and/or materials, touring selected areas of the jail, and having discussions with various jail staff.

The total actual general housing capacity for the Cleveland House of Corrections is 265. On the date of the jail inspection, there were 92 inmates incarcerated in the Cleveland House of Corrections. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction recommended housing capacity for the jail is 138, which is based upon total available living space and other requirements. Officials should maintain prisoner counts within the Department's recommended capacity figure.

The Cleveland House of Corrections (Full Service Jail) is in compliance with 110 standards, 50 "Essential", and 60 "Important".

The Cleveland House of Corrections did not comply with 5 standards, 3 "Essential", and 2 "Important". This letter is intended to serve as a basis for developing plans of action for bringing the facility into compliance with the deficiencies noted during the inspection.

5120:1-8-03 (A) Each full service jail shall maintain the following minimum standards in regard to security of the jail. (1) (Essential) An established security perimeter.

Comments: The age and layout of the jail's Food Service department does not provide an established jail security perimeter. This is due the jail's Food Service rear entrance (single door) which does not provide a security vestibule.

5120:1-8-04 (A) (3) Dormitory Sleeping Space: (a) (Important) Fifty square feet per occupant , except forty-eight square feet in jails constructed prior to 1983, wherein the formula shall be based upon the requirements of paragraph (A)(2)(a) of rule 5120:1-8-04 of the Administrative Code.

Comments: The jail's Housing Unit B dormitory exceeded the Bureau Recommended Capacity on the day of the annual jail inspection, there was not the required amount of day space for each inmate.

5120:1-8-09 (D) (Essential) Health appraisal. Within fourteen days, a licensed nurse, physician, physician's assistant, EMT or paramedic shall complete a health appraisal to determine the medical and mental health condition for each inmate in custody. Such appraisal shall at least include the following:

- (1) Review of receiving screen.
- (2) Collection of additional data to complete the medical, dental and mental health history.
- (3) Laboratory and/or diagnostic tests to detect tuberculosis and other suspected communicable diseases as designated by the health authority.
- (4) Recording the height, weight, pulse, blood pressure and temperature.
- (5) Medical examination as determined by the examiner.
- (6) Mental health assessment.
- (7) Initiation of therapy when determined necessary by the examiner.
- (8) Development and implementation of a treatment plan.
- (9) Other test and examination as determined by the examiner or health authority.

Comments: The jails current policy, procedures and practices needs reinforced to reflect standard and components specified. At the time of inspection, the jail's supporting documentation was not in compliance for this standard

5120:1-8-09 (K) (Essential) Pharmaceuticals. Pharmaceuticals are managed in accordance with policies and procedures approved by the health authority and in compliance with state and federal laws and regulations and include the following:

- (1) The policies require dispensing and administering prescribed medications by health-trained personnel or professionally trained personnel, adequate management of controlled medications, and provisions of medication to inmates in special management units.
- (2) The jail shall develop a policy, approved by the health authority, regarding incoming medications.


Comments: The jails current policy, procedures and practices needs reinforced to reflect standard and components specified. At the time of inspection, the jail's supporting documentation was not in compliance for this standard

5120:1-8-11 (D) (Important) The jail shall provide the opportunity for alcohol and drug abuse treatment, academic training, psychological and social services and other community services.

Comments: The jail must update it's policy, procedures and practices to reflect standard and components specified for compliance. The jail's current practices does not provide inmates access to academic training.

In accordance with Section 5120.10 of the Ohio Revised Code and Executive Order 92-03 of the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, the Cuyahoga County Correction Center, a full service jail, was inspected on 11/16/2016. The inspection was restricted to assessing compliance with a group of standards, selected from the Standards for Jails in Ohio promulgated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. The group of standards being inspected focused on Reception & Release, Classification, Security, Housing, Sanitation and Environmental Conditions, Communication, Visitation, Medical and Mental Health Services, Food Service, Recreation and Programming, Inmate Discipline, Administrative Segregation, Grievance, Staffing, and Staff Training. The inspection consisted of this Inspector receiving and/or reviewing requested documentation and/or materials, touring selected areas of the jail, and having discussions with various jail staff.

The total actual general housing capacity for the Cuyahoga County Correction Center is 1765. On the date of the jail inspection, there were 2133 inmates incarcerated in the Cuyahoga County Correction Center. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction recommended housing capacity for the jail is 1762, which is based upon total available living space and other requirements. Officials should maintain prisoner counts within the Department's recommended capacity figure.

The Cuyahoga County Correction Center (Full Service Jail) is in compliance with 112 standards, 53 "Essential", and 59 "Important".

The Cuyahoga County Correction Center did not comply with 2 standards, 0 "Essential", and 2 "Important". This letter is intended to serve as a basis for developing plans of action for bringing the facility into compliance with the deficiencies noted during the inspection.

5120:1-8-04 (A) (2) Housing Cells: (a) (Important) Seventy square feet for single occupancy forty-eight square feet in jails constructed prior to 1983.

Comments: The jail has exceeded the Bureau Recommended Capacity for their facility in Jail II; there is not the required amount of cell space for each inmate.


5120:1-8-04 (A) (3) Dormitory Sleeping Space: (a) (Important) Fifty square feet per occupant , except forty-eight square feet in jails constructed prior to 1983, wherein the formula shall be based upon the requirements of paragraph (A)(2)(a) of rule 5120:1-8-04 of the Administrative Code.

Comments: The jail has exceeded the Bureau Recommended Capacity for dormitories in their facility; there is not the required amount of dormitory sleeping space for each inmate.

The Cuyahoga County Correction Center is in compliance with 100% of the Essential Standards and at least 90% of the Important Standards meeting the requirements of a "Compliant Jail". It should be noted however; the jail did not comply with 2 of the Important Standards upon which the facility was inspected. This letter is intended to serve as a basis for developing plans of action for bringing the facility back into compliance with the remaining deficiencies noted during the inspection.

The Bureau of Adult Detention encourages the jail to correct the remaining deficiencies noted in the inspection report prior to the next annual jail inspection. Plan of Action forms are enclosed and can be submitted through the Ohio Jail Management System (OHJMS) at [www.OHJMS.Intelligrants.com](http://www.OHJMS.Intelligrants.com). occupancy, stacked bunks, one hundred ten square feet with nine feet least dimension for double occupancy, single bunks.

The North Royalton City Jail is in compliance with 100% of the Essential Standards and at least 90% of the Important Standards meeting the requirements of a "Compliant Jail". It should be noted however; the jail did not comply with 1 of the Important Standards upon which the facility was inspected. 
The Solon City Detention Facility (Full Service Jail) is in compliance with 115 standards, 53 "Essential", and 62 "Important".

In accordance with Section 5120.10 of the Ohio Revised Code and Executive Order 92-03 of the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, the Beachwood City Jail, a 12-day jail, was inspected on 03/28/2017. The inspection was restricted to assessing compliance with a group of standards, selected from the Standards for Jails in Ohio promulgated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. The group of standards being inspected focused on Reception & Release, Classification, Security, Housing, Sanitation and Environmental Conditions, Communication, Visitation, Medical and Mental Health Services, Food Service, Recreation and Programming, Inmate Discipline, Violations and Penalties, Administrative Segregation, Grievance, Staffing, and Staff Training. The inspection consisted of this Inspector receiving and/or reviewing requested documentation and/or materials, touring selected areas of the jail, and having discussions with various jail staff.

The total actual general housing capacity for the Beachwood City Jail is 13. On the date of the jail inspection, there were 7 inmates incarcerated in the Beachwood City Jail. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction recommended housing capacity for the jail is 13, which is based upon total available living space and other requirements. Officials should maintain prisoner counts within the Department's recommended capacity figure.

The Beachwood City Jail (12-Day Jail) is in compliance with 112 standards, 53 "Essential", and 59 "Important".
