RE: 2016 Annual Jail Inspection

Dear Sheriff Russell Martin:

In accordance with Section 5120.10 of the Ohio Revised Code and Executive Order 92-03 of the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, the Delaware County Jail, a full service jail, was inspected on 09/14/2016. The inspection was restricted to assessing compliance with a group of standards, selected from the Standards for Jails in Ohio promulgated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. The group of standards being inspected focused on Reception & Release, Classification, Security, Housing, Sanitation and Environmental Conditions, Communication, Visitation, Medical and Mental Health Services, Food Service, Recreation and Programming, Inmate Discipline, Administrative Segregation, Grievance, Staffing, and Staff Training. The inspection consisted of this Inspector receiving and/or reviewing requested documentation and/or materials, touring selected areas of the jail, and having discussions with various jail staff.

The total actual general housing capacity for the Delaware County Jail is 286. On the date of the jail inspection, there were 217 inmates incarcerated in the Delaware County Jail. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction recommended housing capacity for the jail is 286, which is based upon total available living space and other requirements. Officials should maintain prisoner counts within the Department's recommended capacity figure.

The Delaware County Jail (Full Service Jail) is in compliance with 110 standards, 53 "Essential", and 57 "Important".

The Delaware County Jail did not comply with 4 standards, 0 "Essential", and 4 "Important". This letter is intended to serve as a basis for developing plans of action for bringing the facility into compliance with the deficiencies noted during the inspection.

5120:1-8-04 (I) (Important) Noise levels shall not exceed seventy decibels in daytime and forty-five decibels at night.

Noise levels shall be documented using a sound level meter set to the A-scale (decibels.)

Comments: At the time of the inspection, the jail provided noise levels readings that exceeded night time readings and some daytime readings.

5120:1-8-05 (G): The jail shall maintain documentation that the following standards are met with regard to interior lighting: G3): (Important) Lighting in inmate sleeping areas shall be reducible to between two and four foot-candles, measured thirty inches above the floor.

Comments: At the time of the inspection, foot candle readings provided by the jail exceeded the requirements for this standard. Lighting in inmate sleeping areas shall be reducible between two and four foot candles, measured thirty inches above the floor.

5120:1-8-09 (L) (Important) Dental care. Inmates shall be provided dental and oral care under the direction and supervision of a dentist licensed in the state of Ohio. There is a system of established priorities for care, when in the dentist's judgment, the inmate's health would otherwise be adversely affected.

Comments: The policy, procedure, and practices need updated to reflect the intent of this standard as discussed at the time of the inspection.


5120:1-8-09 (T) (Important) Emergency response plan - The health aspects of the emergency response plan (mass disaster drill & man down drill). Emergency medical care, including first aid and basic life support, is provided by all health care professionals and those health-trained correctional staff specifically designated by the jail administrator. All staff responding to medical emergencies are certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in accordance with the recommendations of certifying health organizations.

Comments: At the time of inspection, the jail had not provided documentation to corroborate an emergency response plan (mass disaster drill and man down drill) had been conducted during this inspection cycle.

The Delaware County Jail is in compliance with 100% of the Essential Standards and at least 90% of the Important Standards meeting the requirements of a "Compliant Jail". It should be noted however; the jail did not comply with 4 of the Important Standards upon which the facility was inspected. This letter is intended to serve as a basis for developing plans of action for bringing the facility back into compliance with the remaining deficiencies noted during the inspection.

The Bureau of Adult Detention encourages the jail to correct the remaining deficiencies noted in the inspection report prior to the next annual jail inspection. Plan of Action forms are enclosed and can be submitted through the Ohio Jail Management System (OHJMS) at www.OHJMS.Intelligrants.com. The inspection was restricted to assessing compliance with a group of standards, selected from the Standards for Jails in Ohio promulgated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction. The group of standards being inspected focused on Reception & Release, Security, Holding, Sanitation and Environmental Conditions, Visitation, Medical, Food Service, Prisoner Discipline, Grievance, Staffing, and Staff Training. The inspection consisted of this Inspector receiving and/or reviewing requested documentation and/or materials, touring selected areas of the jail, and having discussions with various jail staff.

The total actual general housing capacity for the Delaware City Jail is 12. On the date of the jail inspection, there were 0 inmates incarcerated in the Delaware City Jail. The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction recommended housing capacity for the jail is 12, which is based upon total available living space and other requirements. Officials should maintain prisoner counts within the Department's recommended capacity figure.


The Delaware City Jail (12-Hour Jail) is in compliance with 34 standards.
